A WORD FROM SCOTT DERBY, Master HOA President

Dear Homeowners,

The HOA's Design Review Board (DRB) has reported to the HOA Board of Directors that it has noticed a pattern of decline in DRB applications being

submitted over the past few months. As a result, our community's LCAM (Licensed Community Association Manager) will be ascertaining, during her routine inspections, whether a DRB application for a particular exterior residential project has been submitted and approved.

The HOA board, the DRB, and the HOA's legal counsel continue to make and consider recommendations on how to improve our community's residential design criteria and community standards. Aside from general maintenance of the home's exterior, prior to any major exterior residential project, including, e.g., repainting of the home's exterior, changing any exterior color, replacing the mailbox, roof or front door, changing the landscape design (e.g., as for tree removals, the DRB may require "documentation from an arborist certified by the ISA [International Society of Arboriculture] or a Florida licensed landscape architect that the tree poses an unacceptable risk to persons or property"), installing new windows, making any exterior architectural modification, etc., an application must be submitted to the DRB in addition to whatever else may be required, e.g., City of Tampa permit and/or the approval of the Arbor Greene Community Development District (CDD), etc.; and a Notice of Completion (NOC) must be submitted to the DRB for review and approval once the exterior project is completed.

Enforcement actions - including abatements, liens, foreclosures, etc. - are only taken if and when voluntary compliance fails. 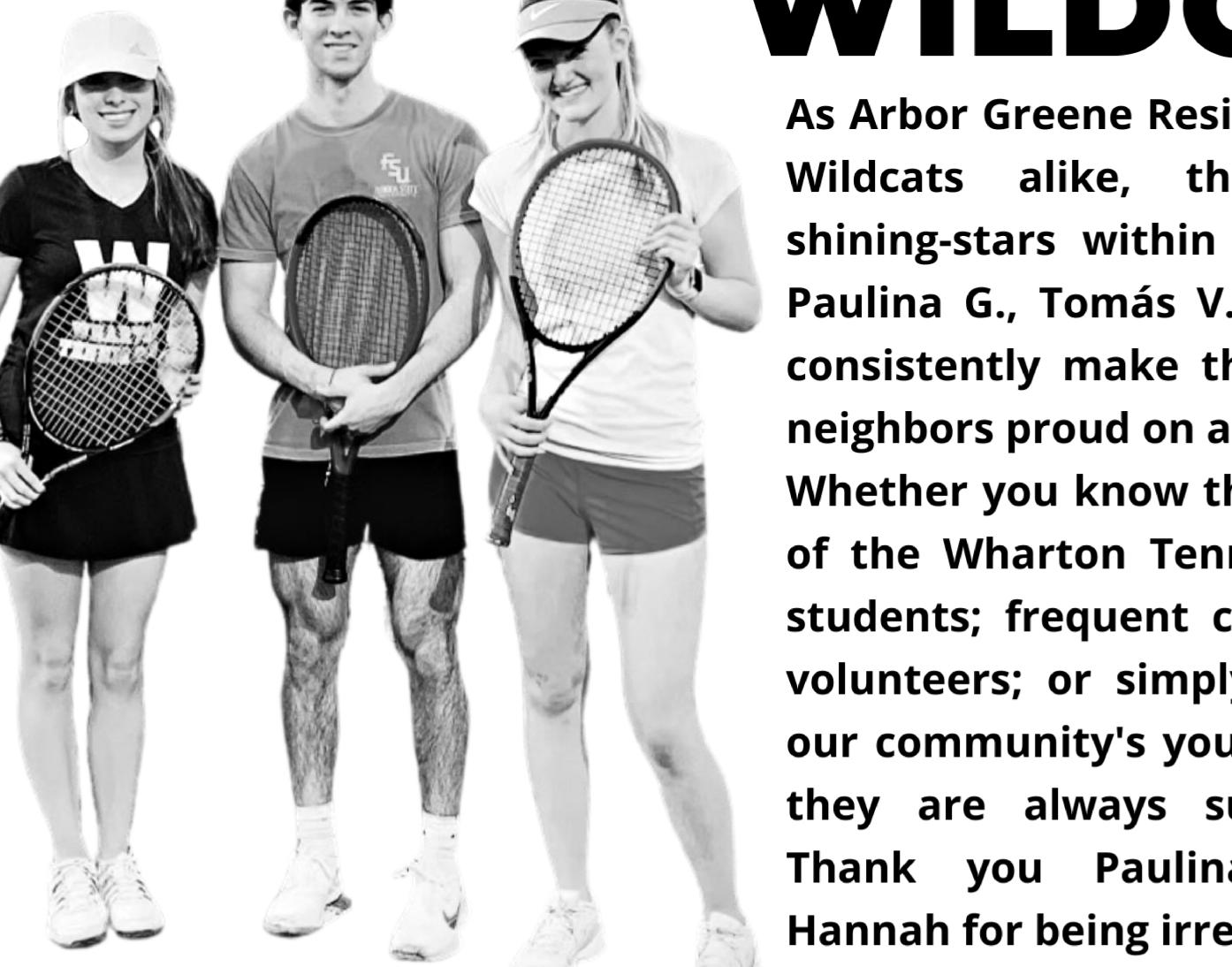

REGULATE YOUR OFF

What are the effects of stormwater runoff? Stormwater runoff is the transport vehicle for pollutants. Any dirt, oil, grease, fertilizer or other pollutants on the ground can be picked up by stormwater runoff and carried into the stormdrains, lakes and rivers. These pollutants

may include nutrients which provide food for unwanted aquatic plants like hydrilla and algae. Excessive algal growth can lead to decreased oxygen in the water that fish need to breathe, resulting in fish kills. Bacteria and other pathogens from pet waste can create serious health hazards in ponds and lakes.

What is an illicit or illegal discharge? Any substance released into the separate storm water drainage system that is not composed entirely of stormwater or uncontaminated groundwater. Examples of illicit discharges include dumping or motor vehicle fluids, household hazardous waste, paint, pool water, grass clipping, yard waste, and/or animal waste.

LISTENING IS MORE THAN HEARING

Active listening is a communication skill that involves going beyond simply hearing the words that another person speaks but also seeking to understand the meaning and intent behind them. It requires being an active participant in the communication process. Consider the following, so that you can have more genuine day-to-day interactions.

- Be fully present in the conversation.
- Show interest by practicing good eye contact.
- Notice (and use) non-verbal cues.
- Ask open-ended questions to encourage further responses.
- Paraphrase and reflect back what has been said.
- Listen to understand rather than to respond.
- Withhold judgment and advice unless prompted.

In communication, active listening is important because it keeps you engaged with your conversation partner in a positive way. It also makes the other person feel heard and valued. This skill is the foundation of a successful conversation in any setting—whether at work, at home, or in social situations.

INCHMENTESSEMMENTS

Exercise is super important for dogs, but as pet owners we need to also enrich our dogs' minds. Enrichment activities are essential to their physical and mental well-being — plus they can be fun for us and our pets! Here are some quick tips for keeping your furry friend's mind on the go!

Feed meals in a food puzzle or slow-feeder. Giving your dog meals in a puzzle or a toy offers them a rewarding problem solving activity they can look forward to every day. These can alleviate boredom, which can lead to less-than-desirable behaviors.

<u>Take a different route</u>. Going on the same old walk every day gets dull for dogs (and probably for you too!) Set out and explore new trails or neighborhoods with your pup. Try out

Here are some quick safety tips to remember when navigating our community as a driver or pedestrian.

- Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times.
- Use extra caution when driving in hard-tosee conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.
- Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too.
- Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing where you can't see.
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.
- Follow the speed limit, especially around people on the street, in school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.
- Be extra cautious when backing up and look for pedestrians.

<u>Play with a friend</u>. Set up a date for your dog to run around with another dog friend in a fenced yard. If they haven't met before, start out by walking the dogs with a friend in parallel several feet apart beforehand in a neutral location to see how comfortable them are with one another.

Let their nose do the walking. Give your dog plenty of time to sniff things when you go on walks, as this can help them burn as much energy as going on a walk. Dogs rely on their noses to tell them important things about the world around them. The olfactory system in dogs can distinguish a staggering variety of scents and can pick up things that can't even be seen at all.

LITERACY IS ET EAMET LEGITIMATE

Did you know we have a Little Free Library at our Community Center? Just across from our Fitness Studio, adjacent to our Community Manager's office, the magic of literature awaits! Why does reading matter you ask? Because we are facing a growing literacy crisis. Today in the United States, more than 30 million adults cannot read or write above a third-grade level. Studies have repeatedly shown that books in the hands of children have a meaningful impact on improving literacy. The more books in or near the home, the more likely a child will learn and love to read.

For context, "Little Free Library" is a nonprofit organization that promotes neighborhood book exchanges, usually in the form of a public bookcase. More than 90,000 public book exchanges are registered with the organization and branded as Little Free Libraries. Through Little Free Libraries, present in 91 countries, millions of books are exchanged each year, with the aim of increasing access to books for readers of all ages and backgrounds.

So how does it work? A Little Free Library is a free book-sharing box where anyone may take a book or share a book. They function on the honor system. You do not need to share a book in order to take one. If you take a book or two from a little library, try to bring some to share to that same library, or another in your area, when you can.

Can anyone I know participate in the Little Free Library? Yes, anyone may contribute or take books. The more the merrier! If you take a book (or two) from a library, you do not need to return that exact book. However, in order to keep the little library full of good choices for the whole neighborhood, the next time you swing by the library bring a few books to share. Again, the Little Free Library book exchanges function on the honor system; everyone contributes to ensure there are always quality books inside. This way, we all win!
